Tour Plan

THIMPHU

Welcome to Paro! Our representatives will be at the airport to welcome you. After that you will go on to drive from Paro to Thimphu, Hotel Check-in & lunch. After Lunch heading to

- **Buddha Point/ Kuensel Phodrang -** Is the largest Buddha statue in the country, from there you can get a good view of the Thimphu valley.
- Institute for Zorig Chusum Commonly known as Arts & Crafts School or Painting School, the Institute offers a six-year course on the 13 traditional arts and crafts of Bhutan. On a visit, one can see students learning the various skills taught at the school.
- **BBS Tower** Drive to Sangaygang BBS (Bhutan Broadcasting Station) Tower at 2,685 meters. The bird's eye view of the entire Thimphu city will be your splendid photo background. You will get to see a lot of colourful prayer flags surrounding the BBS tower.
- National Sport of Bhutan (Archery) One of the best place to witness a game of traditional and modern archery. Which is a national sport of Bhutan? If you want to take some good picture of archery match then this is one of the best places to be. Almost all the time there is a tournament being played.
- Craft Bazaar A one stop place to witness Bhutanese culture and buy Bhutan made art and craft product. The Bazaar in its 80 stalls covers all aspects of the traditional arts and crafts of Bhutan. At this Bazaar craftsmen and artisans from across the country display and sell their handicrafts. And also visit other handicraft stores.

Overnight at Thimphu

Thimphu – Dochula pass – Punakha: After breakfast we start our day visiting following place:

• Drive to **Dochula pass** - (Dochula Pass 3140 m). In the clear spring sky, you can enjoy the panoramic view of the Himalayan Mountain ranges. Then pass by the beautiful 108 chortens built on the hill by Her Majesty Ashi Dorji Wangmo Wangchuck (Queen Mother of Bhutan) for the security and well-being of His Majesty, the King of Bhutan.

After Lunch we will view Punakha dzong from opposite site.

- The Punakha Dzong was built back in 1637 and has served as an enduring symbol of a united Bhutan since. Dzongs are distinctive forts that have served as administrative centers in Bhutanese districts for centuries. The Punakha Dzong is the largest dzong in Bhutan and one of the most regal places to visit in Punakha. The beautiful complex is the epitome of architecture in Bhutan, and its beautifully decorated rooms and prayer halls are a treat for visitors that come here.
- Punakha Suspension Bridge is the longest suspension bridge in Bhutan measuring 180 m in length. From the bridge, you can get a spectacular view of the Po Chhu river (male river) and the valley. It's an ideal place for a photoshoot with a stunning background. You will definitely enjoy the cool and breezy vibes from the suspension bridge

Evening drive back to Thimphu, Over night at Thimphu

PARO

• Simtokha Dzong - Simtokha Dzong is the first ancient fortress to be built in the Kingdom and the



first building to incorporate both monastic and administrative centres. The central tower is three storeys high with prayer wheels surrounding the courtyard. One of the interesting features of the dzong is that there are more than 300 slate carvings depicting Buddhist figures. Today, it also houses one of the top-ranking Dzongkha language institutes aside from being an important Bhutan's historical monument. Visiting Simtokha Dzong will allow you to gain insights into Bhutan's early days.

- Tamchog Lhakhang Bridge Located on the other side of the river of the Thimphu Paro highway, one needs to cross an iron chain suspension bridge to get to the Lhakhang. About 50 minute drive from thimphu towards Paro, Tamchog Lhakhang sits across the Paro River. The Lhakhang is approached by an iron chain suspension bridge. The Lhakhang and the bridge were constructed by a 13th century Tibetan saint Thangthong Gyalpo. The Buddhist saint was also a blacksmith and an architect. Of the many iron chain bridges built, there are only few left which are still used. Crossing this old bridge can be a thrilling experience for tourists. Some of the original iron chain links used to build this bridge can be found on display in the National Museum in Paro.
- Paro Chhu Paro Chu is also known as Pachu, the main source of this River is from the glacier mountain, which is the second highest mountain of Bhutan, Jomolhari 7350meters from the sea level. Since most of the people are into agriculture farming, they use the Paro river for irrigation, which benefits every one of that place. The Paro Chhu flows through the Paro Valley,
- Paro Airport Bird eye View Paro international airport is the only international airport in Bhutan where you can teach Bhutan via air. It's a small airport with singly runaway and no or very few international traffic. However, it's considered as one of the dangerous airport for landing and also most beautiful airport in terms of landscape and architecture. Hotel Check in and later visit national museum.



• Taktsang Monastery - Visit to Taktsang Monastery Kickstart the day with a hike to Taktsang Monastery, famously known as Tiger's Nest. The Taktsang Monastery which seems perched against the cliff is nearly 3000 meters above sea level. This monument is a most revered Himalayan pilgrimage site.

In the evening stroll through the Paro town and visit local handicraft stores. Over night at Paro
