## **Tour Plan**

## THIMPHU

Welcome to Paro, Bhutan's panoramic district! Dukair representatives will be at the airport to welcome you. After that you will go on to drive from Paro to Thimphu. the modern capital town of Bhutan.

- KUENSEL PHODRANG: On arrival in Thimphu, we will check-in to your hotel. The accommodation is an ideal spot for your exploration of Thimphu. Then visit KUENSEL PHODRANG (commonly known as Buddha Point) where the largest Buddha statue in the country is perched on the hillock overlooking the Thimphu Valley. You may take a nature hike through KUENSEL PHODRANG Nature Park for about 20-30 minutes if time permits.
- TASHICHHO DZONG: After the visit to Kuensel Phodrang visit Tashichho Dzong, a fortress of the glorious religion. It was built in 1641 by Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyel. It houses the secretariat building, the throne room and the office of the king, and the central monk body.
- NATIONAL MEMORIAL CHORTEN: The National Memorial Chorten (stupa) which was constructed in 1974 as a memorial for the third King of Bhutan, King Jigme Dorji Wangchuck.

After breakfast we will take you around to explore the following places in the capital of Bhutan.

- **Zorig Chosum** School of Traditional Painting of Arts and Crafts where students undertake a six-year course on the 13 traditional arts and crafts of Bhutan.
- Traditional Bhutanese paper making factory The handmade paper making in Bhutan stemmed from the age-old tradition that originated in 8th century of Bhutanese history. The handmade paper constitutes a valuable National heritage of Bhutanese cultural identity and is preserved through all the ages.

- National Textile Museum You can see the art of traditional weaving being kept alive and preserved through exhibition and has a good collection of old textiles which are rich in colours and designs. You will also see people weaving with intricate designs.
- **Bhutan Post Office Headquarters** To get personalised Bhutanese postage stamps with your photo on them. You can bring along your favourite photo to put on the stamps and put these stamps on your postcard to send to your family and friends.
- Takin Preserve Which houses takin, the national animal of Bhutan. Taken is a rare animal found in herds in the very high altitudes (13,125ft and over). They live on a diet of grass and bamboo.

After breakfast, Hotel Check-out & drive to Paro, Paro Hotel Check-in & we'll heading to After Breakfast, Drive to Paro and Sightseeing:

- RINPUNG DZONG: Paro Rinpung Dzong (fortress), built in 1645 to defend the valley against Tibetan invaders is now being used as an administration center and school for monks. From the Dzong you will walk down to Rinpung Bridge (Traditonal Cantilever Bridge), oldest bridge in Bhutan. National Museum of Bhutan Explore the museum housed in the Ta Dzong (watchtower), showcasing Bhutanese art, culture, and history.
- NATIONAL MUSEUM OF BHUTAN: Explore the museum housed in the Ta Dzong (watchtower), showcasing Bhutanese art, culture, and history.
- Paro Airport Birds-Eye View Point It is located on the hill overlooking the airport and offers the best view of dramatic landings and take-offs.
- **DRUKGYEL DZONG**: Drive up from Paro town to the north side of the valley to view the ruins of Drukgyel Dzong (18 km). It was from here that the Bhutanese repelled several invading Tibetan armies during the 17th century.

Overnight at Paro

After Breakfast, Hike:

• Taktsang Monastery: Visit to Taktsang Monastery Kickstart the day with a hike to Taktsang Monastery, famously known as Tiger's Nest. The Taktsang Monastery which seems perched against the cliff is nearly 3000 meters above sea level. This monument is a most revered Himalayan pilgrimage site. After the Taktsang hike, immerse in a relaxing traditional hot stone bath experience (optional).

Overnight at Paro

After breakfast, our guide will transfer you to Paro International Airport for your departure flight.
